The Bucklesham Bugle ~ Autumn 2021



We are pleased to tell you that normal service has resumed and we are back with face to face meetings in the Village Hall, ensuring we are socially distanced and following all Covid Secure guidelines.

At the September meeting, the Parish Council undertook the annual review of all our Policies, Standing Orders, Risk Assessments and the Asset Register. All of

these documents are available to read on the village website.

We have recently purchased four new village signs which will be installed shortly. These new finger pointer signs are to 'The Church', 'Playing Field' and 'Village Hall', which will really smarten up the lanes by replacing the old rusty signs that are there at the moment.

We are a very proactive Parish Council, and over the last few years we have applied for several different grants for many village projects. The total amount of money received for the village, by way of 49 different grants, is £114,420. This money has bought sports equipment on the Playing Field, renovated the Village Hall, started up new village groups, supported existing village groups, purchased a defibrillator, signs, fences and picnic benches. We will continue to apply for any money available to us on your behalf, ensuring that we are doing our best for the village by providing facilities that improve the lives of us all.

We have been informed that in the next few years we should be receiving in the region of £60,000 Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) from East Suffolk Council. This money can only be spent on specific projects, and we have recently been investigating the installation of a Tennis Court on the Playing Field, following a request by a villager. There are ongoing cost implications for many projects which would have to be paid for via the precept from all villagers' Council Tax contributions. Once the money is received, and before any such project is undertaken, we assure you we will survey the village and hold a meeting to hear all ideas, listen to any concerns, and discuss all projects suitable for the CIL money.

This is the last edition of 2021. We thank you all for your support as we continue to work in this voluntary role on behalf of the whole village.

Playing Field News

Calling all Gardeners: At 10am on the 22nd October we will be preparing the ground on the Playing Field (planning the layout and digging holes) for the 420 trees that will be arriving in November. We aim to make a woodland walk around the edges of the field. We would love villagers to take ownership of a tree or two, or maybe plant in memory of a family member. Hopefully, some of the older children from the school will be joining us, but do let us know if you are able to help too, even if just for a few holes or for half an hour – the more the merrier. Please do help out, your Playing Field needs you

We were successful in our application for a grant from the 'Mrs L D Rope Third Settlement' and received £3,000 for 8 new picnic benches to replace the old wooden ones and add more seating areas at the top of the field. We have another grant application underway for the installation of 4 pieces of adult outside gym equipment for the Playing Field and we should hear if we are successful in the next few weeks. This will be free for all villagers to use and will be another asset for the village.

The football goals are kept locked when not in use to ensure that only villagers have access to them. Just email the Parish Council for the combination to the locks. Please ensure you lock them back up after use and please do not share the code with others if they don't live in the village. Due to the size and weight of the goals, young children are not permitted to use them unless with an adult.
