It is so lovely to see the fantastic display of daffodil bulbs around the village, purchased by the Parish Council last Autumn, which are now coming into bloom. We will be purchasing more bulbs each year so if you helped out and would like some more, if your property has a kerbside boundary, if there is a suitable verge near your home, or if you are willing to plant them around the roadside signs,

please get in touch and we will deliver a bag to you this coming Autumn. Thank you for all the positive comments about the new finger pointer signs around the village. These were purchased with the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) paid annually to the village from any new developments.

The **Annual Parish Meeting** will take place on **4**th **May 2022 at 6:30pm** in the Village Hall. There will be a very important discussion on the future use of the Playing Field as unfortunately dog fouling continues to be a real problem. We recognise that it is often not deliberately missed but some people are just not paying attention to where their dog fouls, particularly if it is running free. We would like to hear as many view as possible in order that we make the right decision for us all, so please do come along if you can.

There have been several incidents of inconsiderate parking in Levington Lane, one leading to the bin lorry not being able to gain access to the end of the Lane which resulted in bins not being emptied. It does not bear thinking about what would happen if an emergency vehicle could not gain access. Please do park considerately and not on both sides of the Lane.

Although many villagers expressed an interest in attending a Jubilee Celebration, Cllr Seagroatt is disappointed to announce that due to only two villagers offering help to coordinate this, the Parish Council will not be organising any village events to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting, followed by the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council, will take place on **Wednesday 4th May 2022** starting at **6:30pm** in the Village Hall.

On the Agenda for the Annual Parish Meeting will be the future of the Playing Field. The Parish Council are interested to hear from villagers with suggestions as to how to solve the issue of dog fouling on the Playing Field. Suggestions have included fencing the entire Play Area, requesting no dogs on the Field, or requesting dogs to be kept on a lead on the Field. These suggestions would need the support of the Village, therefore it is vital that everyone has a chance to have their say.

Bucklesham Community Council Report for 2021

Your Parish Councillors were busy again in 2021 with our Community Council hats on and are very proud to report that we successfully secured funding from 6 different grants, all for village projects, totalling £8,085.

We gladly supported the Village Hall helping them through the challenges of Covid and providing the 10 % Third Party Fund of £3,200, which released the £32,000 from Biffa Award for their new roof.

As a team we were also successful in our bid for a grant from Mrs L D Rope Third Settlement which provided £3,000 for the 8 new picnic benches on the Playing Field.

We were delighted to be able to also support the Bucklesham Players this year. The cancellation of the Panto in January due to Covid meant the group incurred several unexpected costs. We managed to secure a grant of £1,885 to help with this and ensure the postponed Panto could go ahead in March. We will continue to ensure that the constitution is fully adhered to and that money raised is spent solely on village projects.

If you know of a village project that may need help in 2022 please let us know and we will endeavour to find a way to support it.

In the interests of transparency, and to allow for full scrutiny by villagers, Community Council business is discussed as an agenda item at Parish Council meetings. To learn more about Community Council please contact the Parish Council Clerk on **buckleshampc@gmail.com**.

Bucklesham Emergency Plan

We are currently considering the merits of establishing an 'Emergency Plan' for the Village. At this stage we are simply collecting names of people who would be willing to be identified as having a skill or equipment that might be useful in an emergency. You may own a 4x4 that would be useful in the snow, or a chainsaw for cutting up a tree blocking the road, or perhaps you have a medical qualification that could be called on if the Village were cut off for any length of time. Your contact details would only be known to a small committee and the SCC/ESC Joint Emergency Committee and you could remove them at any time. If you are registered as a volunteer in the Emergency Plan your actions will be covered under East Suffolk Council Insurance. Jubilee Torch Relay

Bucklesham Playing Field News

The Field is open from dawn til dusk daily and is locked and unavailable for use outside of those times. Following the recent storms we lost 4 more of the old poplar trees on the Field boundary. We have employed the services of a trusted professional Tree Surgeon to examine the remaining trees and remove those deemed unsafe. We are very pleased to tell you that the new Outdoor Gym Equipment is now in situ on the Field and is ready for use. This was paid for by an East Suffolk Council Boost Scheme Grant. We also have two new Chat Benches in the woodland walkway paid for by East Suffolk Council's Community Partnership. Many of the daffodils planted among the woodland walkway are in bloom and the new trees are growing well. Along with David Riddleston, the Playing Field Manager, we are grateful, as always, for the help of the FOPs (Friends Of the Playing Field) in managing the field. We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at the **Annual Parish Meeting on 4th May** to discuss the ongoing issue of dog fouling. The suggestions of a fence around the Play area, a request for no dogs on the field and a request that dogs be kept on a lead will all be discussed. Please do come along in order to have your say.
