The Bucklesham Bugle ~ Autumn 2022



The nights are drawing in and, as Autumn begins this weekend, we say goodbye to a long and hot Summer. The Parish Council requested a meeting with Suffolk Highways to address the many issues we have here in Bucklesham, such as the parking problems at the School, potholes, speeding through the village, passing places on Nacton Lane and inconsiderate parking in Levington Lane

and Field View. Highways consider most of the problems to be behavioural, and therefore we have been asked to remind drivers to please park according to the Highway Code. Parking on the pavement prevents pedestrians, including wheelchair users and parents with pushchairs, from passing safely. We do have narrow lanes in Bucklesham, and parking on Levington Lane and Field View is especially an issue. Emergency vehicles will struggle to pass if cars are parked on both sides of the road, and on occasions the bin lorry has been unable to get through.

The full report on the meeting with Highways is available on our website or by contacting the Parish Council Clerk, however it is fair to say that we are not hopeful of a positive outcome given the negativity of our County Councillor, Patti Mulcahy, and the Community Liaison Officer from Highways, towards any of our suggestions.

Residents can rest assured we will continue to fight for what we deem to be the best interests of the village and if you have any ideas on how to tackle these issues please do get in touch.

The printing of the Bugle costs you, village Council Tax payers, around £500 per year. Why not join the growing number of villagers who receive their copy online rather than through the door? This not only saves on printing costs but saves paper too. We can also email you via the **Bugle Bulletin** email alert service. We can inform villagers of road closures, lost pets, urgent planning applications and emergency meetings – any news that cannot wait for the next edition of the Bugle. Finally, thank you for the support so many of you have shown over another busy year. As a team we continue to work together for the village in this voluntary role and happily give hours of our time attending meetings, planning committees and training; writing and delivering this Bugle; managing the Playing Field; and successfully completing grant applications for what we sincerely believe to be in the best interests of the village.
