# The Bucklesham Bugle ~ Spring 2023



This coming year, all editions of the Bugle have been sponsored by East Suffolk Councillor Mick Richardson's Enabling Communities Budget. Along with Cllr Richard Kerry, Mick has been extremely generous to Bucklesham, helping to fund the felling of the trees on the Playing Field, supporting the new Nest Swing, and more recently sponsoring the Carpet Bowls club for the entire year. This

valuable support for a vital village group will enable the Bowls to continue and hopefully thrive once again following a recent fall in members. The Budget was discussed at length at the last Parish Council meeting and it was decided that, to ensure we could cover all costs involved in managing the village on behalf of all residents, it was necessary to raise the precept this year. We are very mindful that we have a huge responsibility to ensure villagers get value for their money, and therefore a great deal of time goes into carefully planning for any expenditure. The cost of many services has increased dramatically this year and this has had a knock-on effect on our budgeting. We were acutely aware of the pressures of the cost of living for so many villagers and therefore the rise will be less than £2 per year. We discussed the Management Policy of the Playing Field at the last meeting following a concern expressed by a resident. The particular concern was in regard to the monitoring of the way that the Field is used. It was lovely to see new faces at the meeting and to hear how keen residents are to protect our beautiful space. The Field is managed and held in trust by the Parish Council for the benefit of the residents of Bucklesham and their guests. It is paid for solely by the Precept from your Council Tax contributions. We are committed to ensuring that the Field is not abused by people who are not entitled to use the facilities and that it is protected for you all. Therefore the way in which the Parish Council manages the Field will continue as it was before with some additional helpful solutions suggested by residents at the meeting, for which we are extremely grateful. This edition of the Bugle is a 'Local Elections Special' and we hope you will find all the information included helpful.

Many domestic servants in the 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries lived and worked in large houses throughout the country, and it became an established custom on the fourth Sunday of Lent for them to be given the day off to allow them to return home to visit their family and 'mother church'. This became known as Mothering Sunday. This year Mothering Sunday is the 19<sup>th</sup> March, the third Sunday of the month, which coincides with our monthly All Age Praise service taken by our three local Elders. It is always a lovely, easy to understand service suitable for all ages, and following tradition at St Mary's all the ladies will take home a posy of flowers.

# **Parish Council Elections 2023**

Every four years Parish Councillors are required to stand down and then, if they wish, stand for re-election. The past four-year tenure is almost up and during March, April and May 2023 the election process will be followed. Parish Councils are the cornerstone of British democracy. Although often referred to as the 'lowest tier', they are in fact equal to County and District Councils; they just have different functions.

Nomination papers will be available from late February/early March and can be obtained from the Parish Council Clerk. These have to be hand delivered to East Suffolk Council (the offices opposite Melton Station) by 4:00pm on 4<sup>th</sup> April. No posting, faxing, or emailing is permitted (not even a carrier pigeon will do).

Once the nominations deadline passes, ESC will then assess how many nominations they have received for each Parish Council. If there are the same or fewer nominations for the number of seats, these candidates will automatically be elected without a poll being taken. Where there are more candidates than there are seats, then a poll must be held.



Within Bucklesham Parish Council there are 7 seats. If there are 7 or fewer candidates then these people will automatically be elected to office. If there are 8 or more candidates then there will be a poll. Any poll will be held on 4<sup>th</sup> May 2023, alongside the District Council elections.

If you feel that standing for the Council is not for you, you can still be involved by nominating someone else that you feel would be

suitable. Why not approach them and suggest they stand as a Parish Councillor? They may not even have considered it themselves or they may have been secretly longing to be nominated for years.



In the event of a 'Contested Election' (i.e. where it is necessary to hold a poll) candidates are welcome to campaign and produce material about themselves to tempt voters. There are strict rules around this and any candidate who may like to campaign should consult the Parish Council Clerk for the guidelines – homemade rosettes are essential but kissing babies is not strictly necessary.

Whether you want to stand as a Councillor yourself, or want to nominate someone to stand, the most important thing you can do on 4th May is make sure you turn out and vote. We know you may be busy with other things, but it really only takes a few minutes.

"Why should I bother?" we hear you ask:

- Elections have consequences every vote matters
- It's your democratic right not voting is giving up your voice
- It's your money the Council are spending
- Voting is an opportunity for change
- The Community of Bucklesham depends on you 😊
