The Bucklesham Bugle ~ Autumn 2023



We are pleased to inform you that we welcome another new Parish Councillor, Cllr Gemma Marriage, who was co-opted at the September meeting, meaning we now have a full cohort of seven Councillors. Gemma has many transferable skills and is keen to get stuck into village life. Representatives from the Parish Council attended another meeting with Suffolk Highways to address the many issues

we have here in Bucklesham but specifically the speed limit on Brightwell Road along side the school. Cllr Paul West has commissioned a traffic survey to ascertain the speed that vehicles pass the school. The report produced following the survey will be used by the Parish Council to lobby Highways to reduce the speed limit to 30 mph. We will keep you informed of our progress and may ask for your help with our campaign. The Parish Council recently received £29,000 of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) from the Castlemore Homes development on Levington Lane. CIL is a planning charge that the local planning authority impose on new developments. It is given to Parish Councils to spend in their area. There are strict guidelines on how the money can be spent, for example on specific things such as Open Spaces, Infrastructure and Community Facilities. Some of the money has already been spent on the renovation of the Bus Shelter, 3 new benches, the maintenance of the Play Equipment and some new signs on the Playing Field and Grit Bins on Levington Lane and Field View. The Parish Council also gave the Village Hall a grant for further improvements to the Hall. Please let us know if you have any ideas on projects you would like the Parish Council to consider for the rest of this money as, if it is not spent within the time limit, it will have to be returned. We are investigating the possibility of sowing some wildflower seeds on the edges of the Playing Field to improve the environment, encourage bees and other insects and for visitors to enjoy the natural beauty of the area. As a team, your Parish Council continue to work together for the village in this voluntary role and happily give hours of our time attending meetings, planning committees and training; writing and delivering this Bugle; managing the Playing Field; and successfully completing grant applications for what we sincerely believe to be in the best interests of the village. As this is the final edition of the Bugle this year, thank you all for your support **Bucklesham Parish Council** throughout 2023.

20's Plenty for Suffolk

Representatives from Bucklesham Parish Council attended the **'20's Plenty for Suffolk'** information webinar on 22nd June 2023. This national campaign aims to reduce the speed limit in rural, residential areas.

The 20's Plenty Campaign Group are requesting that all Suffolk Parish Councils pass a motion to call on Suffolk County Council Highways to implement a 20mph speed limit on all roads where people and vehicles mix.

The arguments laid out by the 20's Plenty Campaign Group are as follows:

Why 20?

- 1. **Safer**: The UK's Department for Transport estimates that a 1mph lower speed in built-up areas reduces road casualties by 6%. Successful 20mph schemes result in 30% fewer casualties.
- 2. **Cleaner (and quieter)**: 20mph reduces tail-pipe emissions by 25% compared with 30mph and is 50% quieter.
- 3. **Healthier**: 20mph helps to remove the blight of vehicle speed and builds inclusive communities where human activity, including walking, cycling and social interaction, takes first place.
- 4. **Popular**: National and local surveys consistently find 70% support in residential streets; such support rises after 20mph limits are introduced.
- 5. **Accepted** as normal by UK local authorities where 28m people live, including all of Wales where 20mph will soon be the default speed on restricted roads and soon throughout Scotland. 20mph is global best practice where people mix with motor traffic.
- 6. **Compliance:** 20mph is as enforceable as any speed limit. Even with no additional police enforcement, speeds reduce by up to 6mph on faster roads.
- 7. **Affordable (and cost effective)**: Multiple economic, societal and environmental benefits at low cost. Entry signs plus repeaters remind drivers with no need for physical calming or additional enforcement.

8. **Little journey time impact**: Congestion, junctions and crossings are the determining factors in built up areas and 20mph rarely affects journey times or bus timetables.

Bucklesham Parish Council have no jurisdiction over road speed limits and this is not something that we have the power to change ourselves. The purpose of passing a motion in support of the Campaign would simply be to demonstrate to Suffolk Highways the strength of feeling within Bucklesham about the proposal. Before Bucklesham Parish Council discuss this motion we would like to know how you, the residents of Bucklesham, feel about the Campaign and its aims.

The Campaign will be discussed at the next Parish Council meeting on 1st November 2023 at 7pm in the Bucklesham Village Hall. If you would like to let the Council know how you feel about the request for the Parish Council to pass a motion in support of the campaign, please do come along.
